



# St Brendan's Catholic Primary School

## Early Identification of SEND

A potential area of concern is identified by a parent/carer, teacher or outside agency. Concerns can also be identified from the school's progress data, observations or from the assessments of in-year pupil admissions.

Class teacher to complete the pupil referral form identifying: area of concern; impact of differentiated Quality First Teaching (QFT) strategies, any additional provision already put into place and impact of current intervention.

Child is moved to SEND monitoring stage.

Individual Learning Plan (ILP) completed; SMART targets and provisions are identified and monitored.

Individual learning plan reviewed.

After adjusting Quality First Teaching, needs are being met, the child is making expected progress and no further concerns are present.


Removed from SEN Monitoring

Individual learning plan is reviewed.

SMART targets show that limited progress has been made over time and concerns remain. Further assessments and possible referrals are required.

Child is moved to SEND support.

Assess: Assessments to take place from school and referrals made to external agencies. This may include: EP, SALT, OT to identify further support required.



Assess, Plan, Do, Review Cycle (APDR)

Plan/Do: Individual learning plans written and shared on a termly basis. Interventions, provisions and progress are evaluated weekly against the intended outcomes.

Review: Individual learning plans are reviewed termly with the teacher and parents. Provision is adapted according to progress made.

**Inclusive School Funding (ISF)**

If a child does not meet the criteria for an EHCP, the school can request additional funding in which to provide additional support or resources.

**Emotional Health and Wellbeing**

The school can request support for a pupil's mental health and wellbeing. This can include a potential pathway to CAMHS.

**Education Health Care Plan (EHCP)**

Where several Assess, Plan, Do, Review cycles have taken place and limited progress has been observed, the SENCO will review the criteria for an EHCP.
